







Key Vocabulary

 Emmaus	The village where two disciples were travelling to when they met the risen Jesus on the way, but only recognised Him when He broke bread with them.
 Holy Spirit	The third person of the Holy Trinity who helps and guides us, and fills us with God's power and love.
 Pentecost	The day the Holy Spirit came to the apostles, helping them spread the Good News.
 Concluding Rite	The final part of Mass where we are blessed and sent out to live as Jesus' followers.
 St Paul	A great saint and missionary who helped spread the message of Jesus across the world.
 Discipleship	Following Jesus by living like Him and sharing His love with others.

Hear – what scripture will we hear?



- Road to Emmaus (Lk 24:13-35)
- The mission to the world (Matt 28:16-20)
- The group of apostles (Mary) (Acts 1:12-14)
- Early Church (Acts 2:42-47)
- Paul's Letter to the Corinthians (1 Cor 11:23-27)

Celebrate – how we act as Christians



- That the sign of the cross is the shortest summary of the Christian faith.
- That some prayers that reference the Trinity and the work of the Holy Spirit.
- That the celebration of Mass ends by reminding Christians of Jesus' instruction to make disciples of all nations.

Believe – what do Christians believe?



- The disciples recognised Jesus when he breaks the bread. At Mass, what we eat looks like bread, but it is Jesus who comes, the living God. The bread is the Body of Christ.
- There is only one God, who is three Persons. God is a community within himself: an eternal exchange of love between Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We call this mystery the Trinity.
- Through Mary, the Holy Spirit guided the first disciples. She continues to guide our prayers.
- Mass was celebrated in the early Church.

Live – Catholic Social Teaching



- That being a Christian means to share the gospel.
- That Christians today continue to follow the example of the apostles and early Church when they gather to say Mass.
- How the Emmaus story is represented in art (e.g., Caravaggio's Supper at Emmaus; Maximino Cerezo Barredo, Emmaus Triptych 2014; He Qi, The Road to Emmaus, Supper at Emmaus).
- That the mystery of the Trinity is represented symbolically, e.g., Trinity knot.

What should I already know?

- God is love. Love is God's first gift poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit.
- The fruits of the Spirit are the visible signs that a person is led by the Holy Spirit.
- The fruits of the Spirit are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.
