<p>Holy Spirit</p> 	<p>The third person of the Holy Trinity who helps and guides us, and fills us with God's power and love.</p>
<p>Ascension</p> 	<p>When Jesus returned to Heaven, 40 days after the Resurrection.</p>
<p>Pentecost</p> 	<p>The day the Holy Spirit came to the apostles, helping them spread the Good News.</p>
<p>Saul</p> 	<p>A man who persecuted Christians but became a follower of Jesus after a powerful encounter. He is later known as St Paul.</p>
<p>Prayer</p> 	<p>Talking and listening to God</p>
<p>Fruits of the Spirit</p> 	<p>Good qualities that grow in us when we follow the Holy Spirit:</p>

Love - Caring deeply for others

Joy - True happiness in God

Peace - Calm and trust in God

Patience - Waiting calmly

Kindness - Being caring and gentle

Generosity - Willingness to share

Faithfulness - Staying true to God and others

Gentleness - Acting with care and calm

Self-control - Choosing to do what's right, even when it's hard

- Jesus appears to the apostles and the Ascension (Lk 24:36-53)
- Pentecost and Peter talks to the crowd (Acts 2:1-9, 12-13)
- Conversion of Saul (Acts 9:1-19)
- Fruits of the Holy Spirit (Gal 5:22-23)

Celebrate - how we act as Christians



- In all prayers, Christians welcome the Holy Spirit and open their hearts to God.
- Christians pray to the Holy Spirit for help ('Come Holy Spirit').

Believe - what do Christians believe?



- God is love. Love is God's first gift poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit.
- The fruits of the Spirit are the visible signs that a person is led by the Holy Spirit.
- The fruits of the Spirit are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Live - Catholic Social Teaching



- That there are different symbols of the Holy Spirit in art: wind, fire, and dove, e.g., Taizé, Marlene Scholtz's 'Blessed Trinity'.
- The example of a saint who showed examples of peacebuilding in their lives, e.g., St Catherine of Siena, St Bernardine of Siena (IHS), St Rita of Cascia, St John Henry Newman, Pope St Pius X, St Francis of Assisi. Some examples of saints and holy people who lived the fruits of the Holy Spirit in their lives, e.g., St Oscar Romero, St Teresa of Avila.

What should I already know?

- Because God loves us, he gave us his only Son, Jesus.
- God called Mary to be the mother of his Son, Jesus.
- Mary said 'Yes' to God's call.
- Angels bring God's message and are a sign that Jesus is the Son of God.
- The stories about Jesus are in a special book called the Bible.

In Year 3, I will learn:

- The disciples recognised Jesus when he breaks the bread. At Mass, what we eat looks like bread, but it is Jesus who comes, the living God. The bread is the Body of Christ.
- There is only one God, who is three Persons. God is a community within himself: an eternal exchange of love between Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We call this mystery the Trinity.
- Through Mary, the Holy Spirit guided the first disciples. She continues to guide our prayers.
- Mass was celebrated in the early Church.
