 <p>Damascus</p>	<p>A city where St Paul was travelling to when he saw a bright light and heard Jesus speaking to him. This changed Paul's life.</p>
 <p>Liturgy</p>	<p>The special way Christians worship God together, especially at Mass.</p>
 <p>Rite</p>	<p>The set way Christians celebrate sacraments or worship, with prayers and actions.</p>
 <p>Christian</p>	<p>A person who follows Jesus Christ.</p>
 <p>Islam</p>	<p>A religion where people worship one God (Allah) and follow the teachings of the prophet Muhammad.</p>
 <p>Five Pillars of Islam</p>	<p>Shahada, Salah, Sawm, Zakat, Hajj The five most important duties Muslims try to follow to live their faith.</p>
 <p>Common good</p>	<p>Caring for everyone and making choices that help the whole community, not just ourselves.</p>

What should I already know?

Dialogue

- Exodus 12:1-8,15-20, 13:3
- Lk 22:14-23
- For Christians, the Eucharist is linked with the Jewish celebration of Passover.

Encounter

- Some simple facts about how the Jewish festival of the Passover is celebrated by Jews in Britain today.
- Recognise links and simple connections between some Islamic religious laws, beliefs, worship, and life (e.g., belief in one God, the Creator, the significance of Muhammed, importance of the will of God etc.).
- Recognise the importance of artistic expressions of belief in Islam, for example, in Islamic art or religious music.

Dialogue

- The many different writers of the Bible were inspired by the Holy Spirit.
- What Christians call the Old Testament originates in Hebrew scriptures.
- The Old Testament is important for Christians because it speaks of God's covenant with Abraham and is the foundation of the faith of the people of the Old and New Testaments: Judaism and Christianity.
- The Bible was originally written in Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek which were the languages of the writers.
- God's covenant with Abraham is the foundation of the faith of the people of the Old and New Testaments: Judaism and Christianity.

Encounter

- That the Tanakh (or Hebrew Bible) uses different names for God, to express different aspects of His nature.
- That the Shema prayer is the basic creed of Judaism. It encapsulates the intrinsic unity of the world and its Creator.
- Use specialist vocabulary to describe some Jewish beliefs expressed in the Shema prayer.
- A mezuzah as it contains the Shema prayer and on the box is the letter 'Shin' or sometimes the whole word 'Shaddai' meaning mighty, (i.e., God is strong/almighty/powerful) on the mezuzah case.
